
Background on survey

- Surveys all fruit growers every two years about apple thinning and cherry, pear and apple harvest.
- Covers wages and employment practices for domestic workers.
- Uses U.S. Department of Labor (DOL) methodology.
- DOL uses results to establish foreign guest-worker (H-2A) minimum wage.

Schedule of 2013 survey

- Apple thinning July 2
- Cherry harvest August 1
- Pear harvest September 3
- Apple harvest November 15
- End date January 14, 2014



Wage results reported to DOL

- Median wages reported to DOL for:
 - Apple thinning.
 - Red and yellow cherry harvest.
 - Two varieties for pear harvest.
 - Eight varieties for apple harvest.
- Posted by DOL on April 7, 2014.
- Applies to H-2A through 2015.

Employment practices

The 2013 survey included questions about employment practices.

The percentages of the employment practices were calculated by the number of growers, not by the number of workers.



Grower response about apple-thinning employment practices

Minimum thinning standard

- 22.7 percent required a standard.
- 54.4 percent did not require a standard.
- 22.9 percent did not respond to this question.

- 9.3 percent required references.
- 43.5 percent did not require references.
- 47.2 percent did not require prior experience.



Grower response about cherry-harvest employment practices

Bonus

- 7.9 percent offered a bonus.
- 43.5 percent did not offer a bonus.
- 48.6 percent did not respond to this question.

Minimum harvest standard

- 25.9 percent required a standard.
- 45.7 percent did not require a standard.
- 28.4 percent did not respond to this question.



Grower response about cherry-harvest employment practices

- 5.2 percent required references.
- 30.1 percent did not require references.
- 63.7 percent did not require prior experience.



Grower response about pear-harvest employment practices

Bonus

- 12.4 percent offered a bonus.
- 59.5 percent did not offer a bonus.
- 28.1 percent did not respond to this question.

Minimum harvest standard

- 28.1 percent required a standard.
- 55.4 percent did not require a standard.
- 16.5 percent did not respond to this question.



Grower response about pear-harvest employment practices

- 4.1 percent required references.
- 31.8 percent did not require references.
- 64.1 percent did not require prior experience.



Grower response about apple-harvest employment practices

Bonus

- 10.5 percent offered a bonus.
- 83.8 percent did not offer a bonus.
- 5.6 percent did not respond to this question.

Minimum harvest standard

- 26.4 percent required a standard.
- 54.1 percent did not require a standard.
- 19.5 percent did not respond to this question.



Grower response about apple-harvest employment practices

- 4.9 percent required references.
- 27.4 percent did not require references.
- 67.7 percent did not require prior experience.



2015 survey

- The next survey of Washington fruit growers is scheduled for 2015.
- Results will be reported to DOL in early 2016.
