ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

Below is a summary of the State of Washington's PIRL submission:

- 2,054 errors were addressed with hardcoded values, in order to pass WIPS edit checks successfully.
 - o 1,416 records were hardcoded with a value of zero, where the "Highest School Grade Completed" was unavailable.
 - o 407 records were hardcoded with the "School Status at Program Entry" status, where the "School Status at Exit" status was unavailable.
 - o 115 records were hardcoded to remove "Category of Assessment" when the pre-test wasn't present.
 - o 100 records were hardcoded,
- in order to pass various WIPS edit checks successfully.
- A/RTAA data prior to May 2019 was not available for reporting due to technical issues.
