This hearing is convened to consider testimony concerning: (1) Rules related to backdating applicants for standby status; and (2) rules related to pension deductions from unemployment benefits.

Notice of this hearing was published in the Washington State Register on October 2nd, 2019, as WSR 19-19-031, and WSR 19-19-065, and sent to interested parties via the Department's Gov delivery system.

A concise explanatory statement of the 13 Agency's reasons for adoption of the rules, including 14 a summary and response to all comments received for 15 16 each rule, will be sent to all requesting and 17 commenting parties and placed in the permanent 18 rule-making file. 19 A concise explanatory statement for each 20 rule will also be published on the Agency's 21 rule-making webpage, which is 22 WWW.ESD.WA.Gov/newsroom/rulemaking. 23 For a brief explanation of the proposed 24 rules:

(1) Backdating standby: Standby means the

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claimant is temporarily unemployed because of a lack of work but expects to return to work with their regular employer within four weeks; expects to begin full-time work with a new employer within two weeks; or is temporarily unemployed due to a natural disaster.

The amendments address circumstances when claimants should be allowed to backdate applications for standby after employees confirm an expected return-to-work date.

Requests may be backdated for one week for any reason or for any number of weeks at the convenience of the Department.

(2) Pension deductions: Under current rules, retirement payments are deducted from maximum payable benefits -- benefits payable. The proposed rules will deduct retirement benefits from weekly benefit amounts addressing circumstances when claimants are seeing delays and exhausting benefits.

We will now hear testimony from those in attendance concerning the proposals.
